There they become a useful means of transportation and, in many cases, a way to generate income through repairs and resales. Cyclo Nord-Sud actions and education tools are part of a broader vision encompassing the principles of nonmotorized transportation, reuse of resources, social justice, and fair trade as well as the promotion of women's issues and international solidarity.
